- Choosing who and where a meeting is located to engage traditionally hard to reach communities.

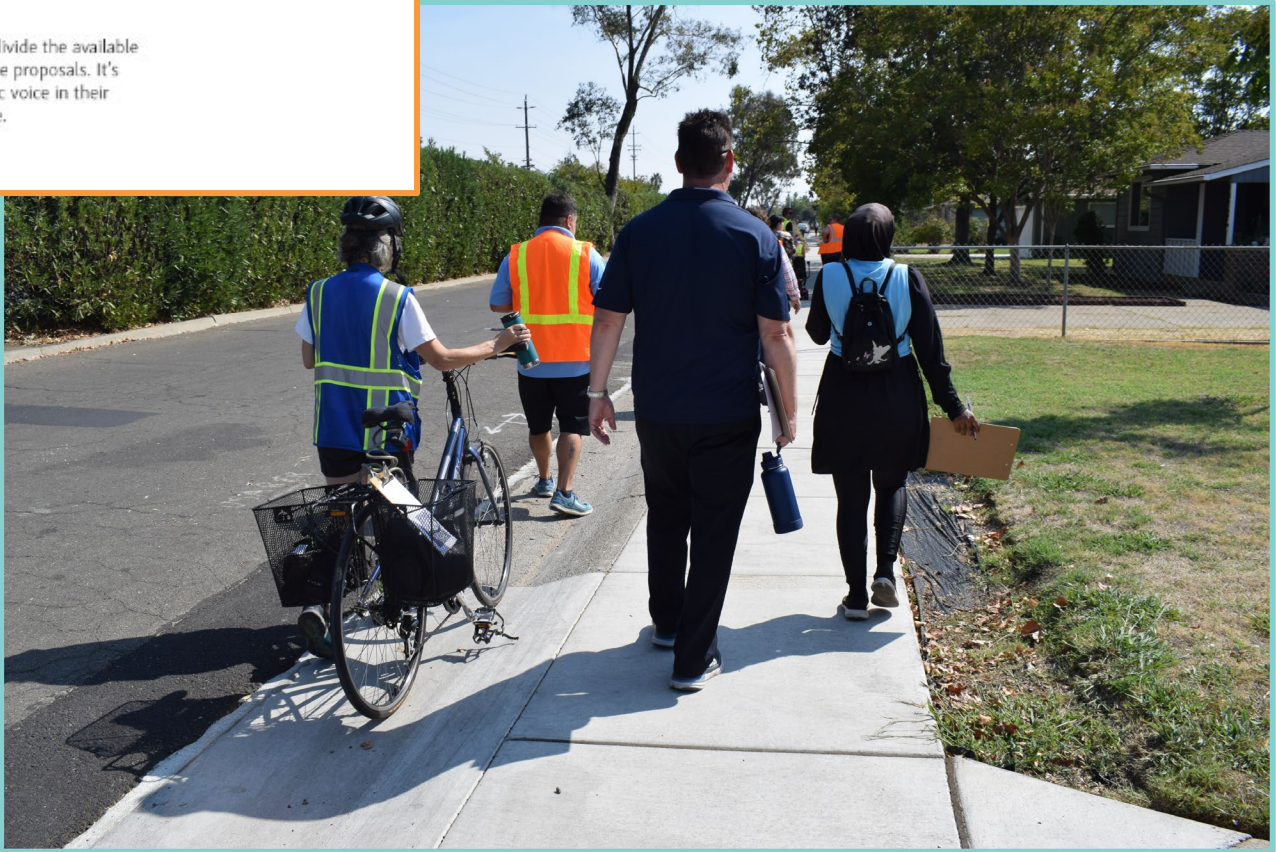
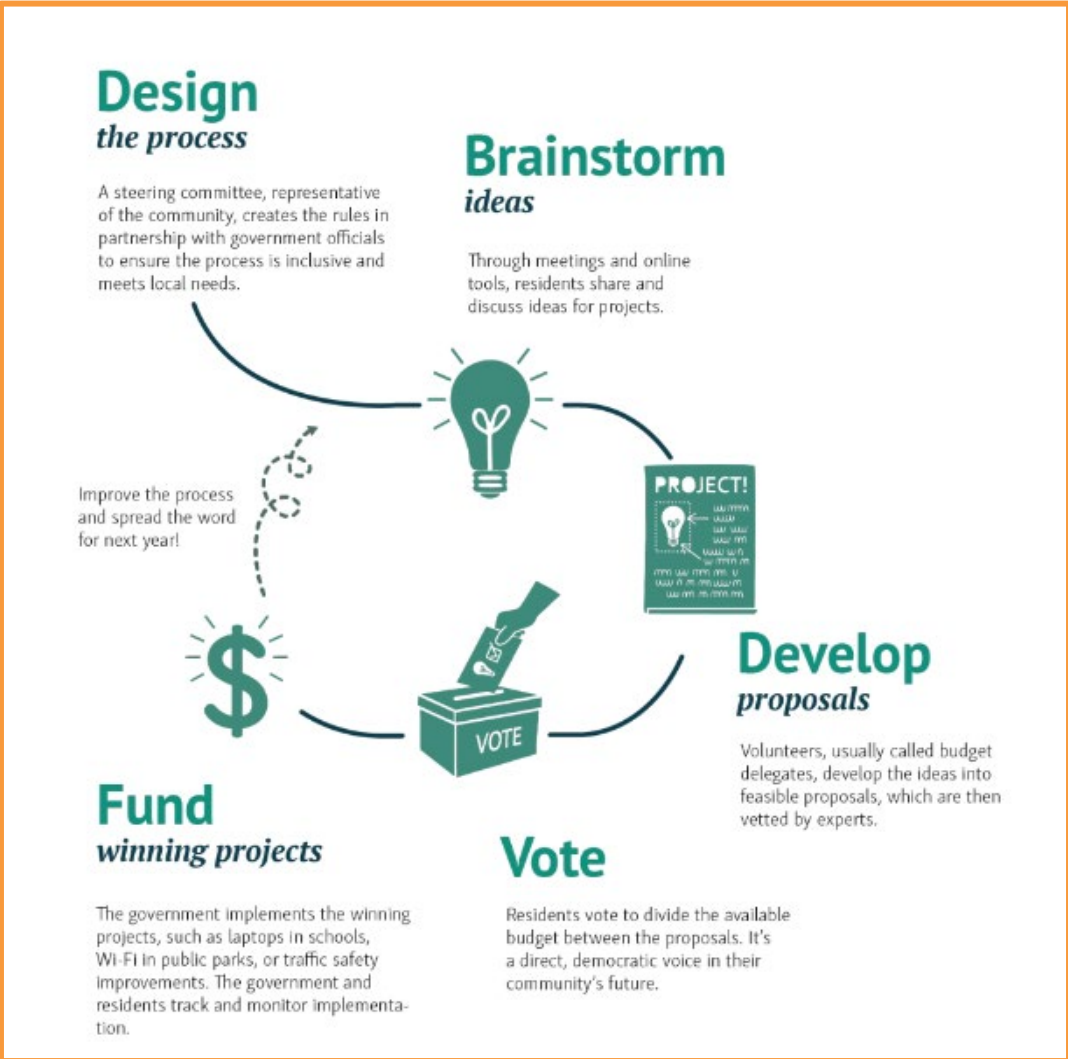

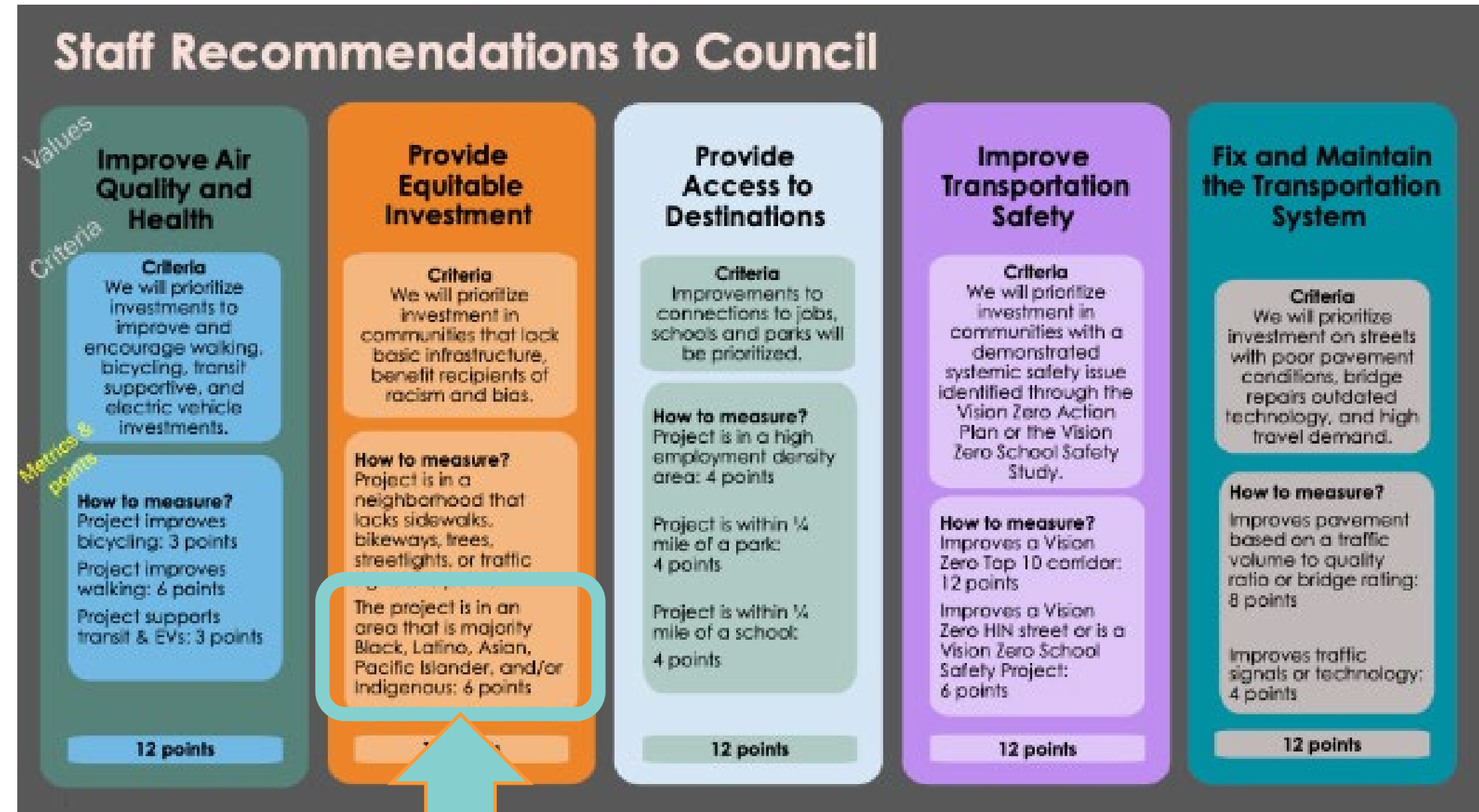
Community Led Initiatives

- Participatory Budgeting: Letting community prioritize the value of solutions.



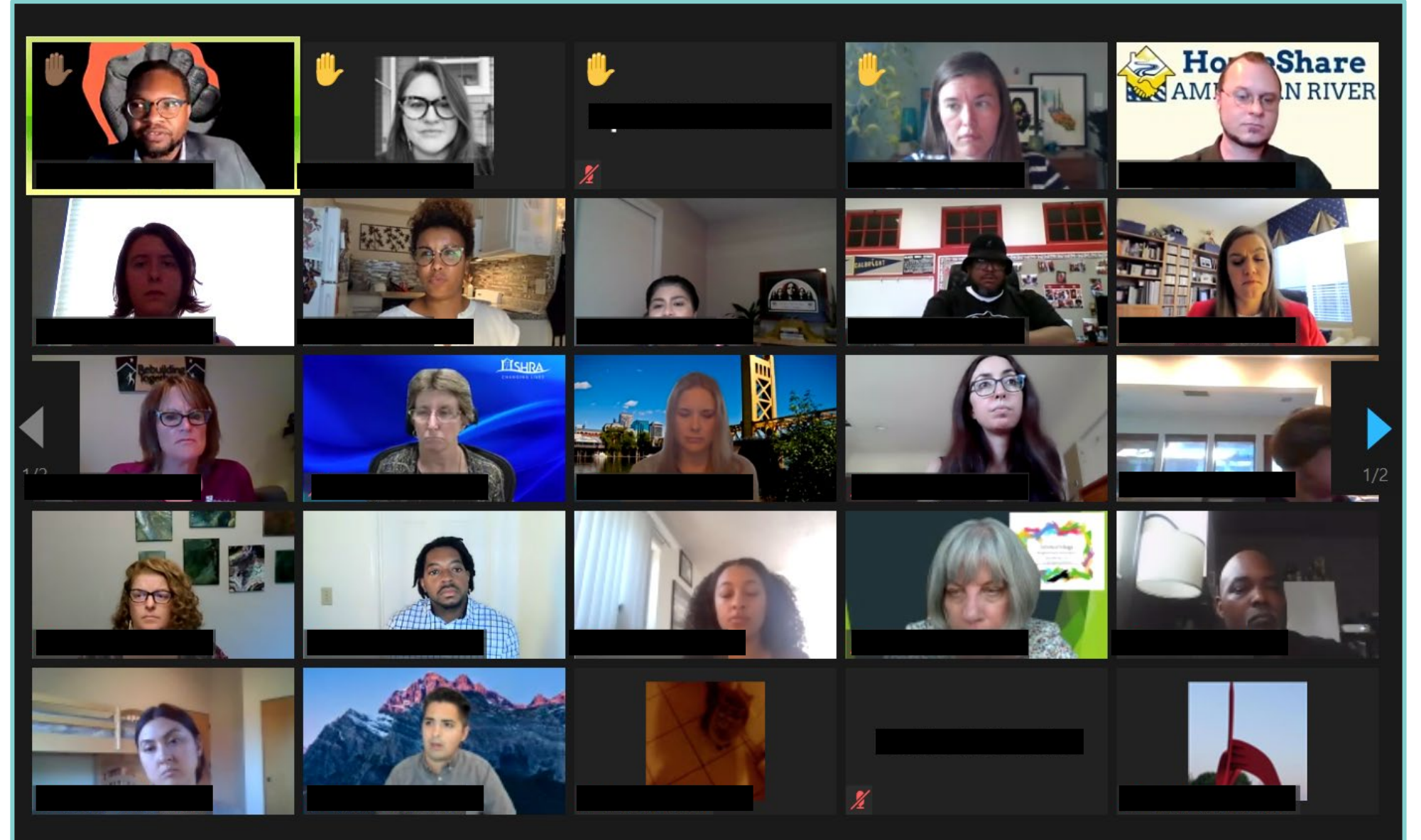
